HISTORY

The California Southern (CS) Railroad connected SanDiego to San Bernardino, the Cajon Pass and Barstow. It was completed in 1885 under a partnership with the Santa Fe Railroad (Myrick, 1963:774). This line became part of the Los Angeles and Salt Lake (LA&SL) Railroad through track agreements in 1905 (Serpico, 1988; Signore, 1988). The CS and LA&SL connected to the Mojave Northern and Cushenberry Mine Railroads. The CS line went through the Oro Grande and Barstow Mining Districts.

The portion of the CS in the Mojave Desert is described in our report on the LA&SL railroad.
